“William “Bill” Wright To Be Inducted Into The African American Golfers Hall of Fame During Its Second Annual Induction Celebration At The Wigwam Resort, Spa & Golf Club”

“The 2nd Annual African Golfers Hall of Fame Golf Tournament, Auction & Celebration” will be held at the Wigwam Resort & Golf Club in Litchfield Park, AZ (Phoenix) during the period May 25-30, 2006. Despite the fact that minority participation in golf grows exponentially each year, Blacks still remain very much a disenfranchised group on and off the golf course. The AAGHOF has begun to remedy this by institutionalizing the recognition and celebration of our historic involvement in “the growth of the game of golf.” The AAGHOF and Inner City Youth Golfers’, Inc. (ICYG) have established an annual event at which the African-American golfing community can network, interact and share their own stories about golf “then and now.”

The specific purpose of the AAGHOF is to celebrate and honor the history and achievements of African Americans in the game of golf. The goals are to establish a place where the rich, colorful and proud history of African Americans in golf is specifically showcased and displayed for the world to see; to work diligently to find, review, and honor those African Americans who have made a lasting and positive contribution to golf and to their communities; to provide an interactive educational learning experience for all young and senior golfers; to acquire and assemble the most comprehensive collection of African American golf memorabilia in the world and to purchase land and build a permanent AAGHOF complex complete with a practice facility, learning center and golf museum for generations to come.

The African-American golf community is at no loss for stories documenting the struggles, tragedies and ultimate triumphs of African-American golfers. However, in spite of all these challenges, little has been done to recognize the accomplishments of those who really paved the way for today’s minority golfers.
